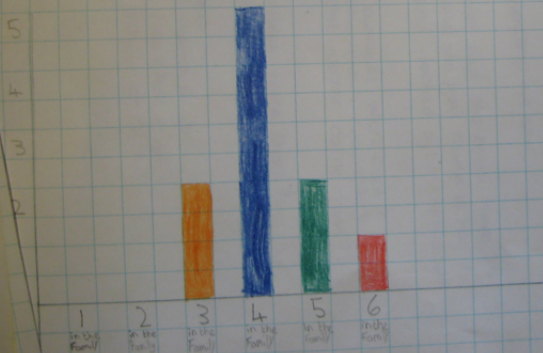

## 1 Wealthy People

Victorian Christmas.

Victorians started many of the Christmas customs we have now. It was Prince Albert who brought over the first Christmas tree. They were called to light the tree. Christmas cards became very popular during the 1870's. The Victorians also began custom of hanging stockings up on Christmas. The rich people gave presents to the poor. In country they would give them blankets, clothes food. Servants were allowed a day off and also given small presents. Town children looked forward to a visit to the pantomime. In the cities there would be people singing carols and performing short plays. ✓

## Meals during Victorian Times

### 1 Wealthy People

These people would have eaten a wide variety of fresh meat, fresh vegetables and fruit. They would have 4 or 5 meals each day.

Breakfast

Lunch

Tea

Dinner

Supper

### 2 Poor families

The meal was cooked over a fire or on a kitchen range in the main living room.

They would have only 2 or 3 meals each day.

Breakfast :- dripping, toast and tea

Dinner :- Soup made from scraps and bones

Tea :- Meat, bread and tea.

Poor people in towns had few fresh vegetables and very little fresh fruit.

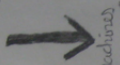

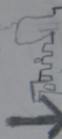

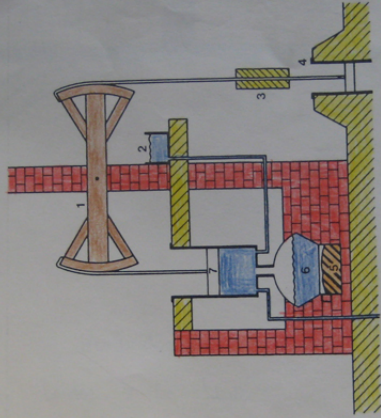

## Thomas Newcomen's Steam Engine

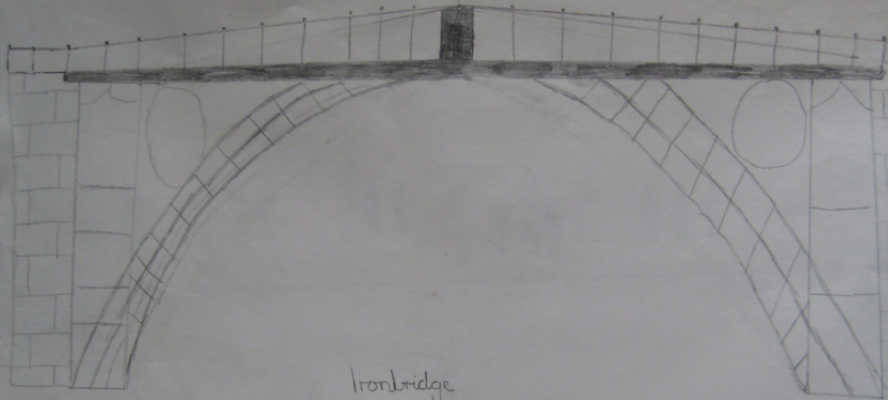

The poke bonnet was almost universal, but an attempt was made to make it from the face by pulling down the brim at the sides.

1840-1850



This is a bonnet with lots of ribbons and bows.

1850-1860



This is a hat with a ribbon hanging down past the shoulders.

1860-1870



This is a hat with cherries on and a ribbon.

1870-1880



This is a hat that looked like a hair band. With a big bow.
