

**EXCEPTIONS ORDERED
UNDER EMBARGO RULE**

**Hull Eases Title Transfer Re-
quirements on Exports**

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10—Some exceptions to the requirements of the Neutrality Law requiring transfer of title on goods exported from the United States to the belligerent countries were made today by Secretary Hull.

Under the President's discretionary authority to make exceptions in application of the law, Mr. Hull specified that the transfer-of-title requirements should not apply to:

"Personal effects and household goods or any other articles or materials intended for the personal use of any United States citizen traveling on a valid passport.

"Articles or materials exported for relief purposes by the American Red Cross or by any person or organization authorized to solicit and collect contributions under the rules and regulations issued by the Secretary of State.

"Arms and ammunition intended exclusively for sporting or scientific purposes, when carried on the person of an individual or in his baggage.

"Articles and materials the shipment of which originated outside the geographic United States and which are shipped through the United States in bond or which arrive at a port in the United States merely as an incident of transit between two foreign points, whether or not transhipped in a port of the United States, if the shipper is outside the geographic United States and is not a citizen of the United States, or an agent of such citizen of the United States or an agent of such citizen."
