I have the honour, under instructions from His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, to inform you that in his final report on the circumstances leading to the termination of his mission to Berlin published as Command Paper No. 6115, of which a copy is enclosed herein for convenience of reference, Sir Nevile Henderson expressed warm appreciation of the great sympathy and willing assistance which he and the members of his staff received from the United States Embassy in Berlin in connexion with the winding up of the affairs of His Majesty's Embassy and their departure from Germany.
