YHAT of the Freezery dated July 12, 1940, and of its enclosure, a photostatic copy of a letter dated July 12, 1940, addressed to the Treasury Department by the Secretary of State, relative to the opening and maintaining of accounts at this bank in the name of the British Government and transfers thereto of the dollar balances and gold from accounts in the name of the Bank of England.

In accordance with the instructions of the British Government as set forth in the letter of the Secretary of State, and in accordance with cable instructions previously received from the Bank of England in its cable No. 586/NO. of June 20, 19NO, we opened accounts on our books for and in the name of the British Government, and made transfers to such accounts, at the close of business on July 12, 19NO, as follows:

We opened a dollar account designated His Britannic Majesty's Government Current Account F and credited \$2,909,765.12 thereto by transfer from the account designated Bank of England Account F, this amount being the balance in the latter account immediately prior to such transfer;

We opened a dollar account designated His Britannic Majesty's Government Current Account 6 and credited \$27,760,902.56 thereto by transfer from the account designated Bank of England Account 6, this amount being the balance in the latter account immediately prior to such transfer;

We opened a dollar account designated His Britannic Hajesty's Government Special Account A and credited \$21,146,171.98 thereto by transfer from the account designated Bank of England Account A, this amount being the balance in the latter account immediately prior to such transfer; and

We opened a gold account designated His Britannic Majesty's
Government No. 3 Account and transferred thereto all the gold
(said to contain 3.824,927.632 ounces fine gold) held immediately
prior to such transfer in the account designated Bank of England
No. 3 Account.

(1) Our cable to the Bank of England No. 845/40, dated July 12, 1940, advising of the opening of the accounts in the name of the British Covernment and of the transfers thereto as described above.
