and giving him the substance of the conclusions reached at the O.D.C. meeting on the other points discussed in the Report of the New Zealand Defence Conference. The minutes of the meeting have not brought out the political difficulties which are present in the case of Tonga and our treaty obligation to defend the Protectorate, but the matter can be left until we hear from the High Commissioner the result of his approach to the Tonga Government.

The question of the force to man the coast defence battery will have to wait until we hear from the Admiralty. The decisions of the New Zealand Government on the Air recommendations of the Defence Conference are in (5.B), but their decisions on the Army recommendations are not yet available. I have worded the draft telegram accordingly.



In point of fact, however, there will be no difficulty about this, and Major Jacob, to whom I have spoken on the telephone, agrees that it will be safe to telegraph on the lines indicated in the draft;

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- (b) as regards the proposed company in Tonga, the Governor stated in his telegram of the 15th May that if the principle of raising a Tongan company were accepted, he would address us "as to the proportion, if any, of the cost the Government of Tonga might be able and willing to contribute". I told the Committee the substance of this passage, and warned them that unless assistance could be promised from Imperial funds it was quite probable that the Tongan proposal could not be proceeded with. The Committee fully appreciated, I think, the peculiar position of Tonga in this matter, but nevertheless there was a very general feeling that there would be no case for assistance from Imperial funds towards the recurrent cost. In the circumstances, I think that we should be justified in taking the line indicated in the draft;
- (c) the financial proposals in the Governor's despatch of the 17th January have not yet been seen by higher authority. I assume, however, that we can take the line indicated in the draft. Actually, even if Fiji has to increase its recurrent expenditure on Defence somewhat above the figure of £18,000 mentioned by the Governor, I should not regard this as a severe burden, since it would still only represent about 3 per cent. of the territory's revenue. This would be considerably less than a number of Dependencies are having to spend on defence, not to mention H.M.G. in the United Kingdom.

Thus the proposal that H.M.G. should bear half the cost of the landing grounds in Fiji will involve a provision on Air Votes, and Mr.Gilbert (to whom I have spoken on the telephone) thinks that before we make any definite statement on the subject the Finance Branch of the Air Ministry should see, so that they can make the requisite arrangements. Accordingly, I have added the draft letters to the Service Departments and the Dominions Office, sending them the draft telegram for concurrence.

I have incorporated in the draft telegram the amendments suggested by the Departments concerned. I have also been through it again with Mr. Watherston, in order to check a doubtful point about Ocean Island.

I suggest that it should now issue. The file might recirculate in order that we may consider whether further action will be necessary as regards the proposal that the War Office should supply certain arms and ammunition, etc. I understand from Major Mears that there is likely to be no difficulty about this, subject, of course, to the overriding consideration that any demands will have to take their due place in the priority list.
