With regard to the question raised in the last paragraph of your letter, I take pleasure in informing you that we concur in the proposal that detailed arrangements be made directly between the local authorities in the Philippines and in Hong Kong. I may add that when the Department informed the United States High Commissioner to the Philippine Islands on July 1 that

it had no objection to the temporary entry of evacuees
