MESSAGE

FROM

THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

TRANSMITTING

A TREATY BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA SIGNED AT WASHINGTON SEPTEMBER 6, 1940, AMENDING IN THEIR APPLICATION TO AUSTRALIA CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE TREATY FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF PEACE BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND GREAT BRITAIN, SIGNED AT WASHINGTON, SEPTEMBER 15, 1914

SEPTEMBER 13, 1940.—Treaty was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations and together with the message and the accompanying papers was ordered to be printed in confidence for the use of the Senate

THE WHITE HOUSE,  
September 13, 1940.

To the Senate of the United States:

To the end that I may receive the advice and consent of the Senate to ratification, I transmit herewith a treaty between the United States of America and the Commonwealth of Australia signed at Washington September 6, 1940, amending in their application to Australia certain provisions of the Treaty for the Advancement of Peace between the United States of America and Great Britain, signed at Washington, September 15, 1914.

I transmit also for the information of the Senate a report by the Secretary of State regarding the treaty.
