Proposal (a) is concerned with setting up of American industrial organizations in the U.K., and elsewhere for defence projects. The details of this are to be settled in London and we are not required to take any action. Proposal (b) is for recruitment of American Civilian Technical Corps by some agency of U.S.G. This is supplementary to the existing Civilian Technical Corps, which is apparently proving a failure. The recruitment of this new Corps is apparently to be done by the Amricans, and it is they who will presumably have to set up the machinery and do the work. What we have to do is to get in touch with Mr. Harriman or Mr. Hopkins when he gets back, and find out what they are doing and whether there is anything we can do to MARGIN assist. Pending a conversation with one or other of them we might get Squadron Leader Russell to come down from New York and have a talk with him about the existing scheme, the reasons for its failure, and suggestions for THIS the new scheme. As the Air Ministry is apparently particularly concerned in England the Air Attache might be brought in, and also somebody from the British Air Mission. We are Z also asked to obtain from the British Air Mission for transmission to the War Cabinet WRITTEN Offices copies of anything that the Mission send to the Air Ministry about the proposed American Civilian Technical Corps. I should have thought the simplest plan would be for the Mission to send an extra copy to the Air Ministry for transmission to the War Cabinet Offices, but we can discuss that with the Air ш Mission.
